

Transcript: Finding academic journal articles

As well as the print journals, the Library subscribes to thousands of e-journals which you can access online. You can find these by searching the catalogue.

If you know the title or author of the article you're looking for, enter these in the search box.

You can also use keywords to find articles on a particular subject. Enter a search term, for example 'fashion history'. This will search for relevant resources by title and by searching the content of the catalogue record.

You can use the menu on the left hand side to refine by source type. To find online articles, select 'academic journals'.

To limit the number of articles to only the most relevant you can use the options under 'Refine Your Search'. This allows you to narrow your results by date range, publisher, language and subject.

Once you've found a relevant article click the catalogue entry. You'll see more information about the article and a link that will direct you to the full text. In most cases, a link to access the full text in PDF form will be present in the left corner. However, this page will look different depending on what platform provides access to the article
